


April 2021 Progress Report

Vessel traffic monitoring information for the <u>Voluntary Protection Zone (VPZ) for Shipping on the West Coast of Haida Gwaii</u> is provided through the <u>Enhanced Maritime Situational Awareness</u> system and the Pacific Safety Initiative (US). The trial VPZ asks vessels to observe a minimum distance of 50 nm from the west coast of Haida Gwaii¹. For the purpose of data collection, vessel traffic is monitored to 200 nm from the west coast of Haida Gwaii.

During the month of April, a total of **135** commercial vessel transits were observed on the west coast. Of these, **125** transits, representing **93%**, took place <u>outside</u> the VPZ. This represents the fewest number of vessels inside the VPZ to date.



¹ Commercial vessels over 500 gross tonnage are asked to observe a minimum distance of 50 nm with the exception of vessels transiting between Pacific Northwest ports, which are asked to observe a minimum distance of 25 nm, and cruise ships, which are asked to observe a minimum distance of 12 nm. Fishing vessels, and tugs and barges are not included in the trial.


