


## **December 2020 Progress Report**


Vessel traffic monitoring information for the <u>Voluntary Protection Zone (VPZ) for Shipping on the West Coast of Haida Gwaii</u> is provided through the <u>Enhanced Maritime Situational</u>


<u>Awareness</u> system and the Pacific Safety Initiative (US). The trial VPZ asks vessels to observe a minimum distance of 50 nm from the west coast of Haida Gwaii<sup>1</sup>, and vessel traffic is monitored to a distance of 200 nm.

During the month of December 2020, **163** commercial vessel transits were observed within the trial area. Of these, **148** transits, representing **91%**, took place outside the VPZ. This represents the smallest proportion of traffic transiting inside the VPZ observed in one month to date.



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Commercial vessels over 500 gross tonnage are asked to observe a minimum distance of 50 nm with the exception of vessels transiting between Pacific Northwest ports, which are asked to observe a minimum distance of 25 nm, and cruise ships which are asked to observe a minimum distance of 12 nm. Fishing vessels, and tugs and barges are not included in the trial.
